



Minnehaha Creek Canoe Route Map

- 1 Gray's Bay Dam (mile 22.0). Its gates help control lake levels and creek flow. Parking. Restrooms.
 - 2 Jidana Park (mile 21.0). Extensive wetlands show how much of the creek once looked. Parking. Picnic.
 - 3 Minnetonka Civic Center (mile 20.5). Parking. Picnic. Restrooms.
 - 4 Burwell Park (mile 19.5). Tour historic Burwell House. Also the site of three past milling operations. The town of Minnetonka grew around this spot. Parking. Picnic. Restrooms.
 - 5 Big Willow Park (mile 19.0). Parking. Restrooms.
 - 6 St. Albans Mill Site (mile 18.8). NO LANDING.
 - 7 Hopkins Crossroad (mile 17.5). Parking.
 - 8 Minnetonka Boulevard Bridge (mile 16.5). No dock.
 - 9 Knollwood Target (mile 14.8). Parking. Picnic.
 - 10 Creekside Park (mile 13.5). Site of the Globe Mill. Parking. Picnic.
 - 11 Louisiana Avenue (mile 13.2).
 - 12 Meadowbrook Golf Course (mile 12.8). Meadowbrook Lake. NO LANDING.
 - 13 Browndale Avenue (mile 10.6). Required portage around old Edina Mills dam.
 - 14 Utley Park (mile 10.5). Site of the Edina Mill, which became the original center of the City of Edina. Parking. Picnic. Restrooms.
 - 15 West 54th Street (mile 9.5). Required portage.
 - 16 Pamela Park (mile 9.0). Restored wetlands.
 - 17 Lynnhurst Park (mile 6.0). As the creek enters Minneapolis, banks are city park land. The Lake Harriet tributary flows into the creek from the Chain of Lakes. Parking. Picnic. Restrooms. No dock.
 - 18 Richfield Mill Site (mile 5.4). NO LANDING.
 - 19 Lake Nokomis (mile 2.0). Once called Amelia Lake. Parking. Picnic. No dock. A portage is required to access the lake where there are beaches, restrooms and canoe rental.
 - 20 Lake Hiawatha (mile 1.5). Once called Rice Lake. Golf course. Beach. Picnic. Restrooms. No dock.
 - 21 Longfellow Lagoon (mile 0.2). **END OF ROUTE, FALLS AHEAD!** All paddlers must land at this point. On-street parking and parking lot available up hill at Longfellow Gardens.
- Minnehaha Falls. Location of Minnehaha Park, Longfellow House Visitors Center, statue of Minnehaha and Hiawatha, Stevens House and Princess Rail Station. Parking. Picnic. Restrooms.
- Mouth of Minnehaha Creek. Walk a half-mile down the glen to the Mississippi River. Remains of the Minnehaha Mill dam can be seen along the trail.
